Daniel Boone, assisted by Randy Jackson, decorated the houses beautifully inside and out with arrangements of spruce, pine, winterberry, holly, dried hydrangea flowers and red sumac. Garlands of running cedar were draped along the porch railing of the cabin. Darrell Wilson made a wonderful fire in the cabin that provided warmth and light. A leg of venison slowly roasted over

the bed of coals. A trip to the cabin for cookies and hot cider plus a turn in front of the fire knocked off the chill of the afternoon. A large cedar tree decorated with gourds, rag ribbons, pines cones, garlands of popcorn and cranberry, and twigs of purple hedge berries stood in the front room of the Bryant House. Dr. Alex McLeod, youngest son of Dr. Vida McLeod a longtime physician in Southern Pines, was born and grew up in the North Carolina Sandhills. His talk at 2:00 p.m. on Sunday, March 19, is titled "Dreams and Genes: Two McLeod Families and Lower Moore County." The event will be held at Southern Pines Civic Club, 105 S. Ashe Street.

Dr. McLeod attended the Southern Pines schools, received his undergraduate degree from Princeton (1956), his medical degree from Duke (1960), and his MBA from Vanderbilt (1988). He practiced internal medicine in Nashville, Tennessee, for 31 years and served on the faculty at Vanderbilt University.

Dr. McLeod has been active in Clan MacLeod for more than 45 years and is currently president of the Associated Clan MacLeod Societies, the international federation of nine National Societies. He has published articles on Clan MacLeod history and is currently pursuing DNA studies pertaining to MacLeods.

After being closed to the public for a year, Bryant House and McLendon Cabin were re-opened for the Christmas open house event. The Friends of Bryant House Committee worked long and hard to bring this about. The grounds were cleaned by scoutmaster John Jackson and his Boy Scout troop with assistance from Neill and Tara Dowd, Scott and Randy Jackson, and Matthew Truman. Improvements and repairs include: John and Matthew Jackson installed a security system in both houses; Ted Lawrence added weatherboards to the outside back wall of the McLendon Cabin to prevent further deterioration of the logs, replaced damaged cabin porch floor boards with pine boards donated by Foster Williams, and repaired the center section of the main sill in the back wall.
